Requirements:

- Associate degree in Human Services/related field required; Bachelor's Degree preferred
- 2+ years' experience working with vulnerable & diverse families & children required
- Must possess basic skills in MS Office Products (i.e., Word, Excel, Access & Outlook)
- State Driver's License and Auto insurance required
- Full Time position; Hourly (Non-exempt); Standard benefits package

Responsibilities:

- Provide interventions and services that are based off of the program model which help to develop trust, and are family-centered and strength based
- Initiate and maintain regular weekly contact with enrolled families
- Complete 10-12 home visits each week with the goal of completing a total of 40-48 home visits per month
- Develop family service plans in conjunction with each family
- Provide support and education which improve parenting skills, teach families about child development, and promote positive parent-child relationships
- Plan, coordinate and help facilitate monthly Group Connections for enrolled families
- Direct case management: keep track of funder required data
- Maintain collaborative relationships with primary caregivers and community services
- Encourage parents to improve their support system and utilize community resources
- Assist parents to problem-solve and self-advocate for their families
- Maintain paper and computer records of clients services provided in a timely manner
- Follow the National Assn of Social Workers (NASW) Code of Ethics regarding professional boundaries, client confidentiality and other professional ethics
- Provide safe transportation for children and families as mandated by the agency and all applicable laws

Agency Expectations:

- Participate in all individual and group supervision, team meetings and ongoing training
- Exhibit consistent attendance, punctuality and responsible use of personal time with consideration of client/program/agency needs
- Educate and market program to staff and general public
